Secretary's Report:

The secretary's minutes for the July 13, 2020 meeting were published in the August Cloverleaf. Amy Gerhardt moved to approve the minutes as published. Motion seconded by Jarrett Rueth and carried.

Treasurer's Report:

• The treasurer's report was presented by Joan Buchholz. The ending balance as of 9/13/20 was \$20,744.83 for the Leaders Federation and \$13,243.31 for the self-supporting project areas (shooting sports, dog, horse, older youth group, and rabbits). Jarrett Rueth moved to approve the treasurer's report as presented. Seconded by Teri Raatz and carried. Joan Buchholz stated that all required accounting services are now being met by Bookkeeping Plus of Neillsville.

Old Business:

- Jennie Whitmire reported that she, Lori Hendrickson, and Brittney Lowry will be meeting this week to work on the lay out for the plat book. Any pictures of 4-H members/activities desired to be in the plat book can be e-mailed to Lori. ROTO Graphics will be printing the book with the plan to have it ready for sale prior to deer hunting season in November.
- The fairboard decided not to allow 19 year olds aging out of 4-H this year to show at the 2021 fair, but they will allow projects made during the 2019-2020 4-H year to be entered at the 2021 fair.

New Business:

- Election of federation board members was discussed. All six youth positions are up for election. Ella
 Raatz, Jacob Kopp, and Jarrett Rueth are willing to run for second term. Three adult positions are open for
 election, with a possible fourth position needed to be filled due to a tentative resignation. Michael Rusin will
 promote need for adults and youth willing to run for these positions. Discussion was held regarding
 changing the meeting night to accommodate schedules, as well as trying to meet physically in small groups
 in different areas of the county, connecting the small groups by ZOOM.
- Michael Rusin will set up a ZOOM meeting on Monday, September 21, 6:00 p.m. for board members to put together goals and calendar for 2021 charter.
- Michael Rusin reported that there are no changes to state guidelines for meeting at this time. He did
 emphasize that groups of up to 50 people can meet together outdoors if divided into smaller groups of 10
 and proper distance maintained between the groups.
