Rules and Guidelines

- 1. Open to all Clark County 4-H clubs.
- The planter container should be a large animal mineral bin/barrel. Common colors are black and blue. Drill holes in the bottom for proper drainage.
- 3. Put your club name somewhere on the planter in a visible location.
- 4. Plants should be started and maintained through growing season.
- 5. Please identify the plants you have placed in your planter.
- 6. Plants should be seasonal and grown in the planter.
- 7. Planters should be in place by 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday.
- 8. Identify individuals who participated in creating the planter.
- 9. Planter locations will be drawn at the July All Leaders meeting. Planter locations will sent to your club's designated contact person via email.

All participating 4-H clubs will receive \$25 for their planter courtesy of the Clark County 4-H Leaders Federation.
