






FOODS AND CAKE DECORATING REVUE

Extension and County Fairs

Extension educators and support staff are not responsible for the fair or any fair related items. The role of Extension is to provide education, respective to each educator's program area, to the public and promote their programming.

Extension is not responsible for answering questions about the fair, the fair book, or Blue Ribbon. Staff within the office may happen to know the answer, but the Extension office should not be the first or main contact for any fair related questions or concerns. There is a majority of youth that participate in the fair that also participate in 4-H, but that does not mean that Extension is responsible for the Junior Fair or any part of it. Extension educators and support staff job responsibilities do not include fair duties.

The Extension office may provide temporary general help and support for Fair operations. The nature and level of this service will be determined by Extension staff based on staffing capacity and alignment with educational roles. This could be temporary or limited general support as a result of a fair staff illness.

Extension may also send out communication on behalf of the Fair Board (i.e. important updates) to 4-H families and FFA advisors, via 4-H Online or email, as our office utilizes 4-H Online and email as a way to quickly communicate with all 4-H members/families and FFA advisors.
