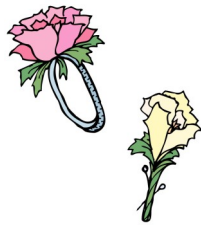

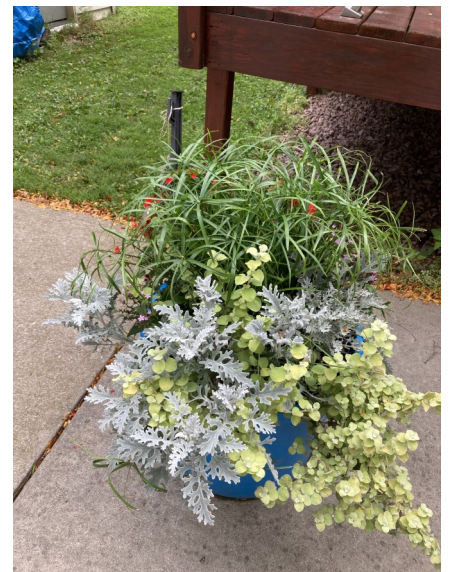

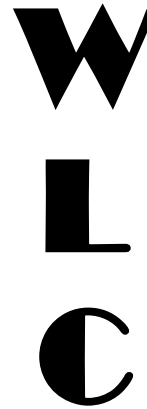

Why do we go through the charter process each year?

The purpose of the Charter is that it represents an agreement between your 4-H Club and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). Completing a charter annually ensures your club is organized in accordance with the rules, regulations, and objectives of the 4-H Program established by the USDA.

In other words, since the use of the 4-H name and emblem is authorized under the USDA, we have to make sure we are following all of their guidelines.

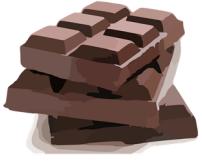

Chocolate Caramel Brownies Makenna Erickson

Ingredients

1 cup butter
12 oz semisweet chocolate, coarsely chopped
1 1/2 cups sugar
4 eggs
1 TBS vanilla extract
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp salt
14 oz caramel candies, unwrapped
1/4 cup heavy cream
1 1/2 cups pecans chopped
1 cup semisweet chocolate chips

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees
Heat butter and 12 ounces of chocolate in microwave until smooth. Whisk in sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Stir in flour and salt.
Spread half of batter in a greased 9x13 cake pan. Bake for 18 minutes. Cool for 20 minutes.
Heat caramels and cream in microwave till smooth, stirring as needed. Spread caramel mixture over baked layer. Spread remainder of batter over caramel layer. Sprinkle the 1 cup of chocolate chips and pecans over the batter and bake for 20 minutes.
Cool, cut, and enjoy.

Easy Homemade Triple Chocolate Muffins Alexa Reseburg

Ingredients

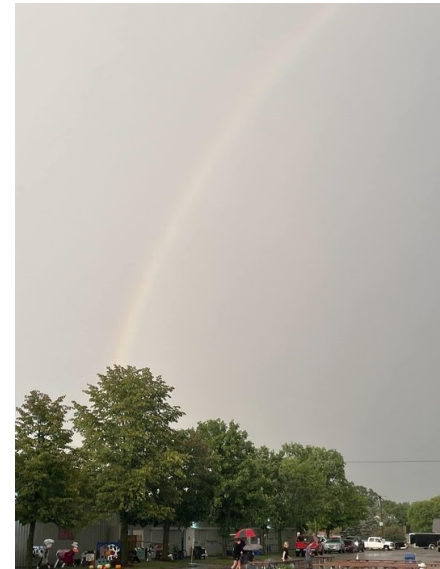
1/2 cup butter, room temperature
1 cup granulated sugar
2 large eggs
1 cup milk
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
2 TBS dry instant chocolate pudding mix
2 tsp baking powder
1 1/2 cups chocolate chips
1/4 tsp baking soda
1/2 tsp salt

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a muffin pan with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.
Mix the butter and sugar in a large bowl, until creamy. Add in the eggs, milk, and vanilla. Mix until blended. Add in the dry ingredients and mix.
Fill muffin cups about 3/4 full. Place in the pre-heated oven and bake for 15 minutes. Check for doneness with a toothpick. They're done when the toothpick comes out clean or almost clean.
Remove from oven and cool for 5 to 10 minutes. Enjoy
