Sweetheart Valentine's Buddies Recipe

Ingredients

- 5 ounces white almond bark or white chocolate chips
- 5 ounces red candy melts (can be found at Michael's craft store)
- 1 teaspoon shortening
- 5 cups Chex cereal
- 1 cup strawberry cake mix
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 package Valentine's chocolate M&M's

How to Customize Your Mix

- Candy: chocolate chips: white, dark or milk.
 Flavored M&M's
- Nuts: peanuts or almonds
- Chex Mix: Try vanilla or chocolate!
- Change out colors for holidays

Instructions

- 1. Start by dividing the Chex cereal into two bowls. (approx. 2 1/2 cups in each)
- In microwave safe dish, melt the 5 ounces of white almond bark or white chocolate chips. Add 1/2 teaspoon shortening so that the almond bark will spread evenly. Microwave 30 seconds at a time and be careful not to burn the almond bark. Dump this in the first bowl of Chex and mix evenly to coat all of the cereal.
- 3. Melt the red candy melts next, also checking and stirring the candy melts 30 seconds at a time. Once this is melted, pour this over the second bowl of cereal and mix until coated.
- In two gallon size Ziploc bags, put 1/2 cup strawberry cake mix and 1/4 cup powdered sugar in each bag. Dump each bowl of Chex mix in each bag and shake until coated with the powdered sugar and strawberry cake mix.



2022 Guidelines for County Chairs

ALL items, including Bonus Category, must be pre-registered. Registration is due August 1, 2022. Any items NOT pre-registered will NOT be judged or displayed. Only one entry on each registration form. Send all forms together immediately after county show including written entries. A County may enter a total of 12 entries plus one Bonus Category 20. A county cannot have duplicate entries in any lettered sub-category. The County Cultural Arts Chair must include a self-addressed postcard or email address to verify receipt of registration forms. If you do not receive verification within three weeks, please call or email the WAHCE Cultural Arts Chair.

IMPORTANT: All entrants MUST sign the Registration form. Please read and sign below; entries will NOT be accepted if unsigned. Entrants will not hold WAHCE responsible for any loss or damage to any item submitted for use in the WAHCE Cultural Arts Show. Entrants give permission for their photo, photos of their entry, and/or print copies of their written entry to be used by WAHCE as seen fit. Judges have authority to put items in proper category if needed.

All work must be done by entrant and completed after last year's county show. It must receive a first place at this year's county show or fair. All items must be clean or laundered or will be disgualified by the judge. Kits and patterns may be used as long as entrant does all the work. All easels must have securely taped label with name, county and district.

Entry Day: Deliver items Sunday (9/18/22) from 7-9pm or Monday (9/19/22) 9-11:30 am. Judging will begin at 12:30PM. Members may view the show after the Monday evening activity until 10:30pm and during the day Tuesday, September 20, 2022. Hours on Tuesday for viewing will be announced or posted. Pickup times will be posted.
