Hot Chocolate Dump Cake Recipe

Ingredients

- 3.4 oz. box chocolate fudge instant pudding mix
- 2 envelopes hot cocoa mix, divided
- 11/2 cups milk
- 1 box chocolate fudge cake mix
- 4 cups mini marshmallows, divided
- 11 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips
- Hersheywers chocolate syrup
- Whipped cream for garnish (optional)
- Chocolate chips for garnish (optional)



Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9 x 13 pan with cooking spray and set aside.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, add the pudding mix, one envelope of hot cocoa mix and the milk. Whisk to combine.
- 3. Stir in the dry cake mix until moistened. Fold in half of the marshmallows (2 cups).
- 4. Transfer to the greased pan and spread out evenly with a spatula. Sprinkle the chocolate chips on top of the cake batter.
- 5. Bake for 35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean. Remove from oven and place pan on wire rack.
- 6. Immediately sprinkle the remaining marshmallows on top of the cake. Allow the cake to cool on the wire rack for one hour.
- 7. Before serving, sprinkle the remaining envelope of hot cocoa mix on top of the cake (use a sifter for even coverage).
- 8. Garnish with whipped cream and/or a drizzle of chocolate sauce or chocolate chips.

Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies Recipe

Ingredients

- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup canned pumpkin puree
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 2 cups (12-ouce bag) milk chocolate chips, not semisweet
- Nonstick cooking spray or parchment paper

Directions

- 1. Heat the oven to 350 degrees. Spray cookie sheets with nonstick spray or line them with parchment paper.
- 2. Using a mixer, beat the butter until smooth. Beat in the white and brown sugars, a little at a time, until the mixture is light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, then mix in the vanilla and pumpkin puree. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, and cloves. Slowly beat the flour mixture into the batter in thirds. Stir in the chips. Scoop the cookie dough by heaping tablespoons onto the prepared cookie sheets and bake for 15-20 minutes, or until the cookies are browned around the edges. Remove the cookie sheets from the oven and let them rest for 2 minutes. Take the cookies off with a spatula and cool them on wire racks.
