- Sewing Retreat At Fanny's. Good turn out.
- Foods Day Same day as sewing. Good turn out.
- Youth on the Rise 5 youth signed up. Making things with yeast.
- Fun with Cake Decorating 2 youth signed up.
- Art Beat 5 youth attended.
- Camp Counselors 8 out of 19 are from Clark County. Jarrett and Ella spoke about what they did during their training.
- Base Camp June 6-9 for 3-5th graders. 14 out of 43 are from Clark County.
- Outpost Camp June 6-9 for 7-9th graders. 3 out of 17 are from Clark County.
- Cloverbud Camp July 9-11 for grades K-2. Can do 1, 2, or all 3 days. Cost is \$25 per day.

• Whitewater Rafting - July 23rd for grades 7 and up. Will join with Portage, Wood, and Marathon counties. There will be a limit of 10 per each county. Will be on the Wolf River/Shot Gun Eddies. There potentially could be a 2nd bus. A \$750 grant was received to be shared with all 4 counties.

• Explore WI - 5 youth are signed up. Need 3-4 more. July 16-18 for grades 5-8.

• Americorp Members - WI 4-H is partnering with Americorp to help with recruitment. This is in place of a summer intern. They will begin May 20th through the last Friday in August.

- Dog Project There will be a meeting Tuesday night for adult leaders.
- Shooting Sports There potentially is a volunteer to head this up.
- Next Step Focus will be on legos, welding, woodworking, and art.

OLD BUSINESS

Year at a Glance - In March Seth was asked to put together a google doc in which people could sign up for events/committees. This was not done - he will be working on it.

By Laws - These were handed out to Executive Board members in March and will be discussed in May. Changes to be made will be in the September and October Cloverbud newsletter. Leaders questioned what happens to clubs who have no one attend the required All Leaders Meeting. Seth will check into this.

To get more interest in the fair, everyone brought in a past fair project and explained how they made it and what ribbon they got. Jack Wendler showed us his 4-H Bingo board.


Ethan Goessl and Katie Nolt had birthdays.



Clark County Dairy Promotions Annual June Dairy Month Recipe Contest Theme is <u>Cheese Curds</u>



Wednesday, June 26, 2024

The contest is held at Loyal City Hall with registration running 6:30 – 7:15 p.m. and the program starting at 7:30 p.m. This event is sponsored by the Clark County Dairy Promotion Committee and the public is invited to participate and/ or attend. The past year's winner will be the current year's chairperson.

The top 10 winners will take home over \$300 in prizes and all contestants will receive a dairy promotion gift.

Rules and Requirements

Any man, woman, or child residing in Clark County may enter.

- 1. The recipe must include at least two generous portions of dairy products.
- 2. Entries must be made from scratch.
- 3. Circle the dairy products on your recipe. Remember eggs, cool whip, and margarine are not dairy products.
- Recipes must be typed or neatly written. Give complete directions, state use of utensils necessary, and include approximate number of servings.
- The name, address, and telephone number of the contestant should <u>NOT</u> be on the recipe. When entries are
 received at the contest a number will be assigned so the recipe and product are judged without a name.
- 6. Contestants must enter their own recipe and must be present for entire program. No exceptions.
- All recipes become Clark County Dairy Promotion Committee and Clark County UW Extension property and will
 not be returned. The committee also reserves the right to publicize any recipe entered.
- 8. The entries will be judged on flavor, use of dairy products, clear directions, appearance, and uniqueness.
- 9. The top winning person will be the contest chairperson for the following year.



Clark County is looking for youth that is interested in Dairy Judging. It does not matter if you are brand new to the dairy world or if you have been in the project for a long time. We are seeking youth that have interest in dairy judging. The goal is to create a Clark County team or several teams that represent Clark County. This opportunity is for youth Grades 3 and up.
