





Contrasting fabrics

Star: 1/3 yd *

Inner border: 1/3 yd *

Background fabrics

15 different fabrics: 1/4 yd each

Binding fabric: 1/2 yd * Backing fabric: 3 1/2 yd

After registering, letters will be sent with more information. Piecemakers Quilt Guild will supply cutting equipment and provide assistance in cutting and sewing of the quilt. The guild will also provide each quilter who completes their top on time, batting and machine quilting of the finished top. Quilters are encouraged to bring their own sewing machines. A limited number of machines will be available.

Camp is limited to 6 participants, with a minimum of 4 participants. Please check the dates as there will be no makeup dates.
